Our first job was chitting our potatoes inside for a few weeks. While this was happening, we prepared the beds adding some well-rotted manure and seaweed. There are some pictures of noses being held as we worked!! The potatoes were planted a little later than usual, but they are

doing well. We have early crop for summer harvesting and main crop for Autumn.

In the Springtime our daffodils dazzled us, and we loved spotting the snowdrops, tulips and crocus appear here and there. These early flowers really help the bees after Winter, and we will plant more each year.

Beetroot, peas, and onions soon joined the spuds in the beds nearby. Our fruit trees are all doing well with lots of red currants waiting to ripen over the summer. We also planted some strawberries and new raspberry canes (after realising that the other canes didn't survive the arrival of the new fencing!) Thankfully, our apple trees are all thriving and full of blossom...... we look forward to some baking in September!
